<b>A</b> uthority	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Who is the author?</li><li>- What are the author's credentials?</li><li>- Does the author have expertise in the subject?</li><li>- Is the author associated with a reputable organization?</li><li>- Is contact information provided?</li></ul>	<p>Websites are developed with various purposes, such as advocacy, commerce, information sharing, marketing, and personal expression. There are no set standards for who can publish information on a specific subject. If the author can be determined, it can be easier to ascertain their expertise on the topic.</p>	<p>To ensure the credibility of a website, consider checking its top and bottom for any clues. Observe the domain endings such as .com, .edu, .gov, .mil, .net, or .org. Additionally, check if the page is linked to the author's or organization's reputable website. You can also look for a page that explains the author's or organization's mission or philosophy. Check other referencing sites to learn more about the author or organization if you have any doubts or questions.</p>



<b>B</b> ias	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Is the information balanced?</li><li>- Is it more opinion than fact?</li><li>- Is the page a presentation of facts or designed to sway opinion?</li><li>- Is a product, service, or idea being sold?</li></ul>	The author's objectives and goals need to be clearly stated, and the internet can be a platform to express one's opinion.	Read through and scan the page to determine the viewpoint. Is there a page explaining who the authors are and their mission or philosophy?
<b>C</b> urrency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- When was the page last updated?</li><li>- Are there any broken/dead links?</li><li>- Is the information consistent with your knowledge of the subject?</li></ul>	Pages with broken/dead links may need to be regularly updated. Knowledge of the subject is essential to have some context. It is vital to have content that is the most up-to-date information.	When reviewing information or facts on a website, verifying if the author has attributed them to a specific year is crucial. You can check the bottom of the website to see if the author has included a date. The copyright year will indicate when the website license was last updated. If you want to be certain, you can always check the last updated date of the website.



<p><b>D</b>ocumentation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Is information documented with references?</li><li>- Are facts supported with evidence?</li><li>- If statistics are provided, what is the source?</li><li>- Is the page free of spelling mistakes or other apparent mistakes?</li></ul>	<p>Anyone can publish anything on the web. Compared to traditional print resources, web resources rarely have editors or fact-checkers. There are no web standards to ensure accuracy.</p>	<p>Please ensure that all facts, references, and statistics have a verified source. Additionally, it is recommended to review the text for any potential errors or misspellings. This will help ensure the accuracy and credibility of the information presented.</p>
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
